Comes the last issue of Tiger Tales (thank the Lord) and the end of the 64-65 athletic year. Ole RHS has collected more than its share of athletic honors. Beginning with football and ending with baseball, the year has been very full.

Football saw "the team with no experience" take a very solid seven victories over only three losses. The Tigers produced a very goodly portion of the all-district performers, and came up with two of the biggest upsets of the year over Bellville and Belton, both pretty big powers until the Tigers took hold.

Basketball was even better, the Tigers took district easily with a perfect 8-0 record. In pre-district play the Tigers really hit it big, a second in the Seguin Tourney, and two firsts in the Bryan Tourney and Rockdale's own tourney. Here the Tigers produced the district's most valuable player, plus two more all-district performers.

Track made the biggest advance over last year by collecting a solid second place in the district meet, where last year Rockdale was way down. Also, Rockdale performers collected one first, a third, and a fifth in the state meet, a total of eighteen points, probably the

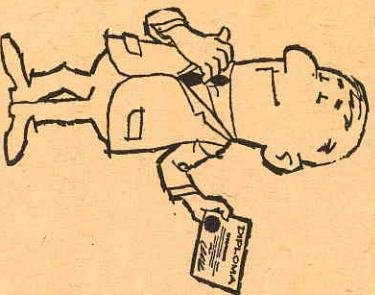

This club, under the sponsorship of Mrs. Ida Jo Marshall, voted to feté the graduating students of the club at a small party during their last meeting.

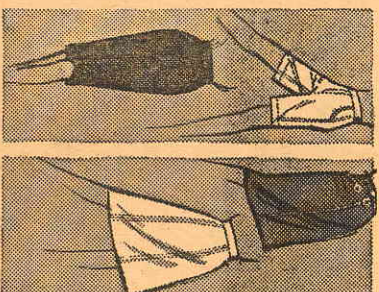

Four RHS Mentors Receive Grants

Four RHS teachers have received grants for summer institutes offered by the National Defense Education Act (NDEA) and the National Science Foundation.

Under the NDEA grant, providing for six weeks summer courses, Mrs. Mildred Petty and Mrs. Mora Jane Baldwin plan to study English and history, respectively, at the University of Texas. Mrs. Maline Caraway will participate in a linguistics institute at Sul Ross State College in Alpine. Mr. Bob Martin, under a grant from the National Science Foundation, will attend the summer physics institute at Texas A&M University for nine weeks.

Teachers from any part of the United States may apply to as many as three colleges from among those participating in the NDEA program. The college selects the most acceptable teachers, giving consideration to the areas in which they teach. An attempt to cover the entire nation is made by NDEA in these summer courses. Only one teacher from each school is allowed to participate in each course.

Qualifications for NDEA grants include the completion of a bachelor's or master's degree in the particular area of study, a contract or other papers indicating plans to teach the following school year, and a letter from the superintendent saying that he will use whatever knowledge the teacher gains in the summer as a part

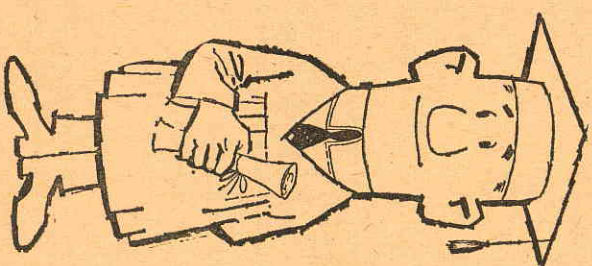
